# What data is available?

- Illinois State Board of Elections Voter File
  - Currently only available to political committees
- US Census Data (2015 Population Estimate)
- Previous data compilations primarily used exit polls
  - Illinois Voter Project contains more exact data

## Active vs. Eligible **Voters**

This map shows the percentage of active versus eligible voters across Illinois


An "active" voter is someone who has voted within the past four years.\*

An "eligible" voter is defined as any Illinois resident aged 18 and over.


Illinois Population: 12.8 Million Active Voters: 7.8 Million Eligible Voters: 10.2 Million

\*If a registered voter does not vote in two concurrent election cycles, the State Board of Elections initiates a process to verify or remove the record. Map data sourced from the Illinois State Board of Elections.

76% of all Illinoisans 18 years and older are active registered voters

Approximately 24% are eligible to vote but not registered

This is a 2% increase from 2015

## **Gender of Active Voters**

This map shows the majority gender of active voters in election jurisdictions across the state.

53.42% of active registered voters in Illinois are female.


46.58% are male. Roughly 3% of active registered voters have no gender listed.

50.9% of all Illinois residents are female, according to the U.S. Census.

Average ages for each jurisdiction ranged from 46 to 56 years of age.


A majority of jurisdictions have average age at 51 or 52 years of age.

In jurisdictions with large colleges and universities, the average age is much lower, as seen on the map.

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

This map shows a dot for every ten votes cast by party in the 2008 Primary Election. It is broken down by Illinois State Senate districts.













# What does the Voter Project Show Us?

- Illinois Republican Primary votes increased 62% from 2008 to 2016
- 53% of active voters are female, 3% higher than the female population
- Voter registration increased by 251,202 from November 2015 to June 2016
  - 80% of these registrants came from Chicago, Cook and the Collar Counties
- Voter turnout averages 60% in General Elections from 2008 2014
- Primary Election turnout averages 30% from 2008 2016
